I think Mildred and Ela had a falling out and Mildred used to speak harshly?? about Joyce.

Joyce graduated from Our Lady of the Lake College and was a strong Catholic, but later in life she married a man (who knew me) that had previously been married (a big no no in the church.) She came to San Antonio and stopped by to visit with us a couple of times.

Other thoughts - Ela sold cosmetics to make ends meet. She had a Ford car that had doors that opened from the front.
